This Privacy Policy is a legal statement that explains how we may collect information from you, how we may share your information, and how you can limit our sharing of your information.

1. Who are we?

This website, *autoflit.com*, is owned and operated by Autoflit. All references to "we", "our" or "us" in this Cookies Policy refer to Autoflit.

2. Purpose of this Notice

When using our website, *autoflit.com*, you trust us with your personal information and we want to ensure you that we will only record your personal information when required.

The purpose of this Privacy Policy is to help you understand what data we collect, why we collect it, what we do with it, and how long we keep it for.

3. What is Personal Data? (Defined by GDPR)

"Personal Data" means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject'); an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.

4. Your Privacy

We are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy and following all legal requirements to do so. We recognise user privacy and data protection as human rights, and we have a duty of care to those whose data we handle. We understand that data should only be collected and processed when absolutely necessary. We will never sell, rent or otherwise distribute or make public your personal data.

5. Relevant Legislation

Along with our internal computer systems, this website is designed to comply with the following national and international legislation with regards to data protection and user privacy:

- UK Data Protection Act 1988 (DPA)
- EU Data Protection Directive 1995 (DPD)
- EU General Data Protection Regulation 2018 (GDPR)

This site's compliance with the above legislation, all of which are stringent in nature, means that this site is likely compliant with the data protection and user privacy legislation set out by many other countries and territories as well. 6. Personal information we collect and why we collect it

This website collects and uses personal information for the following reasons:

6.1. Site visitation tracking

Although GA records data such as your geographical location, device, internet browser and operating system, none of this information personally identifies you to us. We consider Google to be a third-party data processor (see below). GA makes use of cookies, details of which can be found on Google's developer guides.
